## About the performers:

Christon Carney, a native of Nashville, TN, received his Masters of Music in Vocal Performance from the New England Conservatory and his Bachelors of Music in Music Education from Lipscomb University. He debuted in Nashville Opera's production of La Traviata as Giuseppe and has gone on to perform with the Boston Lyric Opera, singing various roles in the chorus, as well as outreach opportunities. He has performed as concert soloist with the Rhode Island Civic Chorale and Orchestra, Nashville Symphony, Nashville's Heimermann Chorale, and has over a decade of choral experience participating in vocal ensembles and premiering new works.

Carney has received honors from several disciplines including the prestigious ABRSM Diploma in Voice and as a finalist in the Alltech Vocal Scholarship Competition. Christon is also a compelling recitalist, performing programs for the Music at Trinity Music Series, Mechanics Hall's Concerts Plus Series, and many others. He has worked as a paid singer and section leader at many religious organizations, including the Parish of All Saints, Worcester, MA. He is currently Education and Community Programs Coordinator at the prestigious Mechanics Hall and is a vocal instructor at the Pakachoag Community Music School in Worcester.

Born in Boston in 1971, **Leonardo Ciampa** is a musician of international reputation. He is Mechanics Hall Composer-in-Residence 2021-2023, Director of Music of Emanuel Lutheran Church, also in Worcester (since 2019), and Maestro di Cappella Onorario of St. Ubaldo's Basilica in Gubbio, Italy (since 2015). He was previously artistic director of organ concerts at MIT (2009-2016) and founding director of Arts MetroWest (2012-2019).

As an organ recitalist, Ciampa has made a dozen European tours, encompassing Italy, Austria, Germany and Switzerland. He is particularly admired in Italy, where he has played in numerous international festivals (Festival Perosiano, Festival Biellese, Organi Storici della Valsesia, Le Voci della Città, Festival Organistico Lauretano, Reate Festival, etc.). He has given solo organ recitals in cathedrals in Vienna, New York City, Boston, Altenberg, Brandenburg, Tortona and Biella, and in basilicas in Rome, Torino, Loreto, Rieti and Gubbio. In August 2022, he will add to that list the Cathedral in Lucca and the Basilica in Tortona.

Ciampa's compositions have been performed in such prestigious venues as Sanders Theatre (Harvard), Mechanics Hall, Princeton University Chapel, Kresge Auditorium (MIT), and the Mormon Tabernacle in Salt Lake City. As a pianist, Ciampa is particularly noted for his interpretations of Chopin, whose 200th birthday he commemorated with six recitals in 2010 at First Church in Boston. Ciampa is the author of several books, most recently *Gigli*.
